Mosaic Life Care Auxiliary

The Mosaic Life Care Auxiliary, an organization of caring volunteers, in cooperation with Mosaic Life Care, promotes community goodwill and provides support to enhance healthcare for patients and their families.

Both the Heartland Hospital West (formerly Methodist Medical Center) Auxiliary and the Guild of Heartland Hospital East (formerly St. Joseph Hospital), now known as Mosaic Life Care Auxiliary, were formed in 1930. Over the years, both organizations have been loyal supporters of quality health care in our community. They have earned money through various fund-raising activities and have provided funding and support for nursing scholarships, hospital equipment, patient assistance and various projects that benefit the community as a whole. Since 1984, the Auxiliary has committed \$3.3 million to hospital and community initiatives.

Mosaic Life Care Auxiliary awards up to six \$1,500 annual scholarships to individuals pursuing a healthcare related degree. Current Mosaic volunteers and interns are eligible to apply.

The gift will name Mosaic Life Care's Cancer Care Healing Garden the "Heckman Family Healing Garden" in memory of Dan's parents, Daniel and Carol Heckman. Their financial support is in honor of the courageous battles with cancer that Daniel and Carol faced.

Heckman's mother, Carol, loved to garden in the backyard of their home on Edmond Street in St. Joseph. Heckman connected the growth of a garden to the growth families may experience when impacted by cancer care. As plants grow, prosper and come back to life every spring, it provides the optimism and extends the same journey to the patient and families who are impacted.

Mosaic Life Care is committed to increasing the number of cancer survivors in our region — bringing hope to patients and their families.

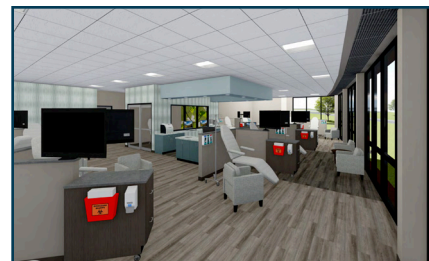

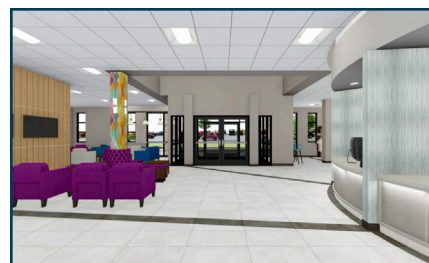

emPowerU Programming

In August 2020, the Foundation Board of Trustees fully committed to making emPowerU programs accessible for all schools in our service region.

Civic Engagement Immersions and e2 Fellowship are now offered free of charge 2020 — 2025 for school districts in our 31-county service region. This is a savings of \$15 per participant for each Civic Engagement Immersion circuit and \$375 per team of three for e2 Fellowship.

Civic Engagement Immersions encourage youth to work collectively as they learn how to address real-life challenges. Through three circuits, every student's voice is heard and all ideas are valued.

e2 Fellowship is a high school intergenerational leadership program that enhances the skills of emerging leaders. The program challenges influences, identifies core values and begins a journey where youth are the creators of the region's future.

At our **2019 Ignite Annual Fundraiser**, more than **350 guests** helped raise **\$147,000** to offset registration fees for underserved youth in Buchanan, Andrew, Nodaway and Gentry counties to attend emPowerU's summer STEAM Camps.

Eight exciting camps were offered at emPowerU in St. Joseph and Think Ahead Works® in King City for children in grades 3 — 8. With a flight theme, the camps introduced the newest, most popular camp: Coding Drones.

In a world of social distancing and virtual learning, emPowerU piloted two new STEAM programs this past year.

STEAM After-School was successfully introduced fall 2020 and builds upon the summer STEAM Camps. This program was created to provide students a collaborative, hands-on learning experience while extra-curricular activities were limited.

In spring 2021, we introduced STEAM Field Trips. Students, in grades fourth through sixth, code drones, interact with robotics and experience virtual reality. These hands-on activities help empower the next generation of innovators.

Mosaic Foundation — Albany

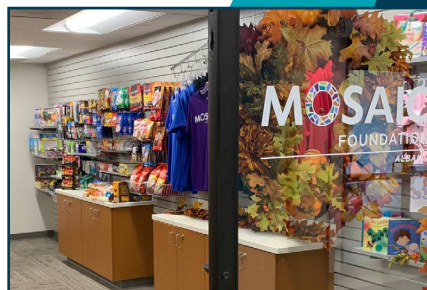
Mosaic Life Care Foundation has expanded our regional presence through an affiliation with Mosaic Medical Center — Albany and their foundation.

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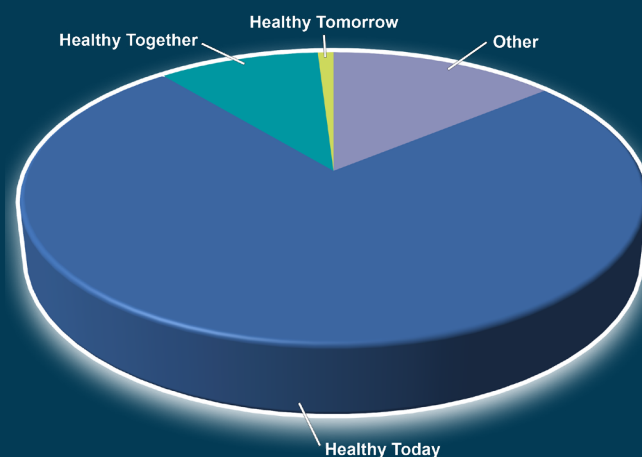
