This was another record-setting year of attendance for emPowerU programming and Mosaic Life Care Foundation continues to value the role each of you take in the education of our region's youth. I am honored to share the continued investment by our board trustees and the waiving of program participant fees for Civic Engagement Immersions and e2 Fellowship through 2025. This savings per school equates to \$375 - \$3,675 depending on the program and the number of participants.



The Foundation's Board of Trustees have approved funding to make this program free of charge through 2025.



Circuit One

Professionally trained facilitators guide participants through the discovery and discussion experience of Circuit One. Current engaging and relevant challenge topics set the stage for students to consider and come to a consensus on possible solutions. The fullday session culminates with student groups presenting their findings to their peers and the emPowerU Council that is made up of regional leaders.

A new and popular challenge topic this year was Disconnect to Connect. Educators selected this topic due to the high concerns of screen time and the COVID-19 impact of face-to-face communication among students.

Circuit Two

Circuit Two transforms the emPowerU facility into a region of diverse cities and towns. Students work within an assigned job, such as mayor or broadcast journalist and are tasked with discovering their community's biggest challenge. Each Circuit Two experience culminates with a live presentation to the student-led' hearing.



21st Century Skill Development

Educators continue to rate the Civic Engagement Immersions highly, as evident by this year's 4.93 satisfaction average. Teachers find the program valuable as they see the levels of engagement and enjoyment students experience as they solve real-world problems. Additionally, they understand its benefit in relation to the Four Cs of 21st Century Skills: Collaboration, Creativity, Critical Thinking and Communication.

Making a Difference in **Bedford**

In September 2022, high school students in Bedford, Iowa, Community School District were awarded a **\$9.148.75** Jump Starter grant to make a difference in their school and community.

Competitive Jump Starter grants up to \$10,000 are awarded to emPowerU participants for student-led community service projects within our service region. During the 2021 - 22 school year, Bedford High School participated in the e2 High School Fellowship program for the first time in history.

During their experience, students Jadyn Bucher and Silas Walston. along with Bedford educator Melissa Peterman, were inspired to create a multi-purpose space that could be used as an outdoor classroom, guiet reading area or picnic area for school district students and the Bedford community.

"Going to e2 Fellowship and learning about leadership, I definitely brought those skills to our school and used what I learned toward this project," Jadyn said.

Students created the outdoor classroom space, designed the structure and are building the area. Community partners involved include the building trades class, Lucas Landscaping, Bedford Building Supply, TC Fabrication and Akin Building Center.

Jump Starter Grants

Since 2006, **\$383,193.75** in Jump Starter grants have been awarded.

e2 High School Fellowship

This intergenerational leadership program enhances the skills of emerging and experienced leaders. With four meeting days during the school year, high school teams from our 31-county service area gather together to learn about their own leadership styles. examine regional challenges and explore ways to implement positive change.

The teams are made up of two high school students and one adult sponsor. The 2022 -23 academic year welcomed **39 participants** from 13 schools. Regional challenges examined included poverty and education effectiveness. New this year, students focused on how school attendance impacts education effectiveness. Ways to implement positive change on school

attendance included incorporating different learning styles and further consideration of how credits are applied toward graduation.

The Foundation's Board of Trustees have approved funding to make the e2 High School Fellowship program free of charge through 2025.




STEAM Programs

In July 2022, the Leah Spratt Charitable Trust granted Mosaic Life Care Foundation funds to upgrade equipment used in emPowerU STEAM programs.

LEGO robotics have been a staple of our STEAM programs for many years. Many EV3 robots have been used in STEAM Camps, STEAM After-School and STEAM field trips. However, EV3 robotics have since been retired by LEGO. The grant provided funding to purchase 12 new LEGO SPIKE Prime robotic sets.

STEAM programs are designed to spark an interest in Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics for students in grades 3 - 8. Activities include hands-on science experiments, coding drones, LEGO robotics and virtual reality explorers.
